• High levels donors (Major and mid-level) - Analysis

There has been a significant increase in both major and mid-level donors, accompanied by a rise in retention rates and average donations. Our strategic focus over the past two years on maintaining current donors and elevating them to higher levels has proven successful, not only in keeping donors at but also in upgrading lower levels contributors to, the high levels.

With the number of high-level donors surpassing half of the total (55%) in 2023, it is important to adopt a more organised approach to managing donor engagement. Previously, Zoe handled this through personal scheduling, akin to meeting up with friends. However, given the escalating number of donors, this method is no longer viable. To ensure effective monitoring of engagement, we have established a living document to outline the top 50 FQ donors and planned event invitations throughout the year. This approach enables us to identify major donors who may be either overbombarded or under-engaged.

• High levels donors - 2024 Special event with Phil Rounsevell and Nelson Estrella

The gathering is scheduled to take place at the residence of Phil and Nelson in Melbourne CBD on Saturday 24 February from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM. Distinguished from the Fifth String event, which primarily targeted mid-level donors (\$1,000-\$9,999), this event has been uniquely branded to focus on major donors, fostering an exclusive atmosphere for the VVIP attendees. We also seek to raise funds for the A Tale of Two Composers campaign in this event.

Preparations for the event are well underway, with arrangements made with Phil and Nelson regarding the catering and rundown. Invitations have been distributed (list as attached). Phil and Nelson have thoughtfully crafted an A6 size leaflet for this occasion. We are delighted to have Delatite Winery as the official wine sponsor for the event. As a gesture of gratitude, attendees will receive handcrafted jam from Zoe as a souvenir.

• High levels donors - 2024 Fifth String event with Faye Goldsmith

This gathering is set to occur at the residence of Faye Goldsmith in Glen Iris on Friday, February 23, from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM. All members of the Fifth String not included in the February 24 event are extended an invitation (see attached list). Preparations are progressing smoothly, with details finalising with Faye about catering and the rundown. Invitations have been distributed. Delatite Winery will, again, be the official wine sponsor for the evening. As a token of appreciation, attendees will be gifted handcrafted jam from Zoe as a souvenir.

• New/small-amount donors (up to \$999) - Analysis

Notably, the number of new donors in 2023 has seen a decrease, attributed to various factors. Firstly, a significant portion of small donations in previous years resulted from ticket cancellations. In 2023, with the world gradually emerging from the shadow of the pandemic, cancellations have decreased, which is actually a positive development. Besides, our smaller-amount campaigns, such as the successful "Hear Her Voice" in 2020 and the "Music Literacy Education" Campaign in 2022 (concluded in early 2023), were not as prominent in 2023. In addition, while our FQ Syndicates were previously prominent in smaller-amount campaigns, there has been a trend of donations surpassing \$1000, especially in FQ Syndicates #4 and #5—which is a positive trend. Nevertheless, we acknowledge the importance in 2024 to convert ticket holders into new donors.

In 2024, our strategy includes launching a dedicated campaign for ticket holders, specifically through a mailing campaign in EOFY. Further details are outlined in *Campaigns*.

• Campaigns - A Tale of Two Composers and FQ Syndicate #6

The A Tale of Two Composers initiative, aimed at commissioning, creatively developing, and recording two distinct works by Melody Eötvös and Rishin Singh, strives to achieve an ambitious fundraising goal of \$50,000, including \$10,000 from FQ Syndicate #6. FQ Syndicate #6 is now complete, and the whole campaign has currently secured \$22,615 (45%), with a pledge of \$10,000 from Julian Burnside for Melody's commission.

We plan to leverage two February donor events by integrating the project introduction into Zoe's speeches, engaging in conversations with guests, and distributing a dedicated informative leaflet within the jam souvenir package.

For the final \$20,000 of the goal, we are actively seeking 2-3 match funders. Prospective match funders may include Michael Aquilina (Wilma Smith's connection) and Reg Holloway and Ian Dickson (Mary Vallentine's connection) who attended our latest post-concert supper on 30 October with Mary. Referrals or recommendations from Board members are highly welcomed. We hope to announce the match funding after the February events to generate momentum for the final stage of the campaign. Our goal is to conclude the entire campaign by April, before the launch of the EOFY campaign.

• Campaigns - EOFY and 25th anniversary campaign

For the upcoming 2024 EOFY campaign, our strategic emphasis centres on commemorating the 25th anniversary of FQ. In addition to our usual email campaigns, we are exploring a new mailing initiative targeting a specific segment—ticket holders and concert subscribers without donation history. This initiative is a response to identified needs aimed at cultivating new donors throughout 2024. While we are confident in the effectiveness of our current email communication with existing donors, we aim to optimise cost efficiency by directing higher-cost mailings toward approximately 200 top ticket holders and concert subscribers from 2022 to 2024.

The mailing packages for this select group may encompass a personalised letter from Zoe, an informative leaflet, a donation form, and a reply envelope. We are currently soliciting quotations from professional service providers in this area.
