2.2	Financial update • 2020 forecast; current surplus forecast in excess of \$100,000, but will continue to monitor closely and pursue all available avenues of funding and COVID-19 support to ensure healthy surplus going into 2021 • Wendy asked for thoughts and opinions about budgeting for philanthropic income in 2021, with anticipated declines in private donations and Trusts and Foundations grant opportunities • Mary recommended going through the donor list and identify those likely to reduce support or remain steady • Kirsty has observed that some foundations are pulling back on holding new grant rounds, and/or have committed to extending funding only to those they already support • Aiming to pursue every possible grant opportunity and focus on funding long term projects (to counteract any decline in philanthropic funding) • A financial catch up Zoom meeting to be scheduled in later September or October to discuss/review draft 2021 budget (Wendy will circulate possible dates)	Wendy
